Biography

Mr. James Quinn joined Lockheed Martin in September 2004, after retiring from the US Coast Guard and working for BAE Systems and JK Scanlan Corporation. His work at Lockheed Martin has been primarily focused upon US Coast Guard modernization in command, control and communications systems.

Mr. Quinn served as an active duty commissioned officer for twenty-one years with the U.S. Coast Guard specializing in surface operations. Assignments included command of two Coast Guard Cutters as well as assignments in Alaska, Hawaii and Germany. While serving as a Security Assistance Officer (SAO) at the U.S. European Command in Stuttgart, Germany, Mr. Quinn was responsible for military to military program development in Africa as well as emerging democracies in post-Cold War Eastern Europe including Albania. Mr. Quinn also worked as an Assignment Officer in the Office of Personnel Management and for the Chief of Staff of the U.S. Coast Guard in what is now CG-83.

Prior to coming to Lockheed Martin, Mr. Quinn worked for BAE Systems Integrated Electronic Warfare Systems in Nashua, New Hampshire where he was responsible for the program development of maritime electronic and acoustic countermeasure and protection systems for U.S. Navy, U.S. Coast Guard and homeland security customers.

Mr. Quinn holds a Bachelors of Science Degree from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, a Masters of Public Administration from Harvard University and a Masters of Science in Management from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology where he was a Sloan Fellow.

Mr. Quinn is active with the Coast Guard Foundation in fund-raising activities and serves as a Member of the Board of Directors for the Association for Rescue at Sea (AFRAS) which promotes and recognizes international maritime search and rescue.
