#### TANZANIA SEA RESCUE

Tanzania has a brand new Maritime Rescue Coordination Center - **but no rescue service!** 

It can take five hours for government and commercial boats to be notified and be underway in an emergency.

Yet, this part of the world is all too familiar with maritime disasters both large and small.

A dedicated group of volunteers is creating Tanzania Sea Rescue (TSR), the nation's first 7 x 24 rescue boat service.

TSR will be based in Dar es Salaam and is in need of lifejackets, communications equipment, funding for a boat – everything you might imagine for a group just starting out.
